Celebrate Saskatchewan's Sustainability Champions

RCE Saskatchewan's 15th Annual Awards for Achievement in Education for Sustainable Development

Wednesday, May 3, 2023, 9:30 am – 1:30 p.m. CST, virtual and in person. E.A. Rawlinson Centre for the Arts, Prince Albert

RCE Saskatchewan's Patron, His Honour the Honourable Russ Mirasty, Lieutenant Governor of Saskatchewan, will be in attendance. Interviews will be available during breaks in the program at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Join us for a unique event honouring champions in sustainability from across the province. The event will honour 34 Saskatchewan projects at a gathering focused on the <u>UN's 17 sustainable development goals</u>.

The projects all educate, encourage, and engage others in local action that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. Recipients will include home grown projects and programs from such diverse groups as the Universities of Regina and Saskatchewan, SaskOutdoors, Cowesses First Nation, the community of Craik, Saskatchewan Polytechnic and others. All dimensions of ecological, economic, social and cultural sustainability are represented.

This is the 15th year for the event, with more than 300 awards being presented since it was started in 2007. <u>RCE Saskatchewan</u> created the awards to honour Saskatchewan sustainable development leaders from businesses, towns and cities, educational institutions and community-based organizations. The RCE is a voluntary network (with founding partners including the University of Regina, University of Saskatchewan, and Saskatchewan Polytechnic) and is one of more than <u>180 Regional Centres of Expertise</u> on Education for Sustainable Development around the world that are formally recognized by the United Nations University.

The event is held in a different community every year. This year's co-hosted is the <u>Prince Albert Historical Society</u>.

Several special recognitions will also be awarded. The <u>Conservation Learning Centre</u> just south of Prince Albert will be awarded the *Excellence in Education for Sustainable Development in the Community Award*. **Prairie Sky School** will receive the Lyle Benko Future Generations Award for its "<u>Miciwina sakahk: food forest</u>" project for outstanding Education for Sustainable Development in Kindergarten to Grade 12. Luther College at the University of Regina will receive the *Dr. Garth Pickard Award for Post-Secondary Excellence in Education for Sustainable Development* for its "<u>Project of Heart</u>."

The lunch keynote address on **The Gathering Place: Sustainability Past, Present and Future** will feature Dr. <u>Charles Hopkins</u>, UNESCO Chair in Re-Orienting Education Toward Sustainability at York University. After the awards ceremony, the event's co-host will provide a guided historical tour of the downtown ending at the Museum's <u>Kistapinanihk/Omanicye Makoca/Tl'ogh tele The Gathering Place</u> exhibit which features Prince Albert's Indigenous history from 10,000 years ago to 1905.

RCE Co-Coordinator, Dr. Roger Petry, is thrilled with the record number of applicants to this year's awards. "Saskatchewan has been and can continue to be a global leader in sustainable development, and all these recipients are positive, focused, creative, and deserving of recognition. Each has a wonderful story to tell, and our annual awards ceremony is an opportunity for them to shine."
