After nearly three years of dedicated service as our Office Manager, we are sad to say goodbye to Max Pekar as he leaves to focus on his professional education.

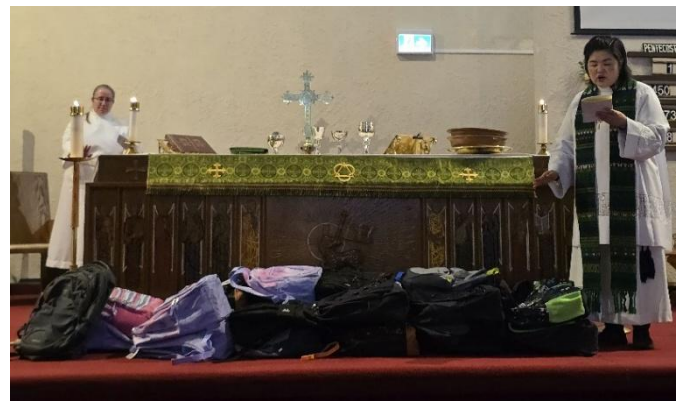
Max has made a meaningful and lasting impact on Immanuel Anglican Church. Through his hard work,
